Gentlemen:



Dear Ms. Gale:

We have received your inquiry as to whether there are any harmful health effects from distilled water when used for drinking water purposes.

Distillation can be an effective means, either by itself or with other separation processes, for purifying water when it is properly designed for the type of contaminants which are present in the water which is to be purified. Any treatment system design should be based on a knowledge of the undesirable contaminants which are either present or which may appear. Where only dissolved minerals are of concern as is often the case, simple distillation can be effective, although there may be less costly processes for some minerals.

We hope this information is useful to you.

Your letter of inquiry about distilled water, which was addressed to Dr. Winterfeldt, was referred to this office for reply.

The distillation process removes all non-volatile material, including minerals. As a result, it is virtually tasteless. Many people describe the taste as "flat." However, there is nothing about distilled water that would make it harmful for the body. It may be helpful to remember that distilled water is the only water available for crews of Naval vessels at sea.

The enclosed reprints describe the various types of bottled waters available on the market. I hope you will find the information helpful in answering any remaining questions.

Thank you for your letter of 16 January 1985. Yes, I did mean to say that ".....while distilled water is safe to drink.....".

Generally, to say a water is soft means to say that it has a low concentration of calcium and magnesium ions. Hardness mainly contributes to taste, soap consumption and solids accumulation (mineral deposits) in hot water heaters and pipes. It is not generally considered a health problem. Distilled water, on the other hand, will contain little if any dissolved solids (cations or anions). So to put it one way distilled water is a purer water than a soft water.

As you requested I am sending you a copy of the 1984 WHO Guidelines for Drinking-Water Quality. This is the updated version of the 1971 WHO International Standards for Drinking Water. The contributors to these guidelines are listed on pages 109 to 115.

Dr. Brooks requested that I respond to your letter of 20 May asking for information on distilled water. Please note first of all that we do not study drinking water here in the Division of Biotic Systems and Resources (formerly the Division of Environmental Biology); this type of research is done by county and state departments of health.

I am trained as an aquatic biologist not as a public health expert, but I can assure you that distilled water is not harmful and that it is not necessary for you to drink distilled water in order to feel safe about your water intake. The nature of drinking water varies greatly from place to place mainly due to changes in the kinds and amounts of dissolved salts (hardness) which do not directly alter healthfulness.

Please check with your local (county) health department for information on the chemical nature of the water in your area. If you have a well, the water can be tested in most counties by simply asking. If you have a public water supply, test results should be available to you and interpreted by health officers. In any case, health personnel are well trained to answer your questions on local water supplies.

For specific information on water quality and distillation, we recommend that you talk with your state or local health departments. They should be able to answer all your questions.

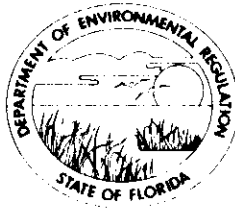

Dear Miss Gale:

Please forgive our belated response to your letter of March 23, 1983; our offices have been moved recently, and some letters were inadvertently misplaced. Your inquiry related to the consumption of distilled water and its possible effects upon the human body.

Many people have consumed distilled water such as rain water or water from lakes and ponds, without adverse effects, for long periods of time. In fact, the mineral content of tap water is usually less than 500 ppm (or 0.05%) of total dissolved solids, so low that water is usually not even considered as a source of minerals for the body. I know of no way that drinking distilled water (distilled in glass or stainless steel, that is) can adversely affect your body.

Think of it this way: nature provides rain as a source of water for all plants and animals, as well as us. After it reaches the ground it begins to dissolve the various impurities which tap water contains. You get virtually 100% of the minerals your body needs from the food you eat.

It is hoped that this gives you an adequate response: if not feel free to communicate with the writer again.

To Whom It May Concern:

It is a real pleasure to express my feelings about the use of distilled water as a health benefit.

I have been a cancer patient since 1979 and after several surgeries and fifty treatments of radiation therapy was left with about sixty-five percent of one kidney. In 1981 I was told that my kidney function was continuing to deteriorate and a restrictive diet would be necessary to reverse this trend. I was also told at this time that I had a tumor in the chest area that was inoperatable. Early in 1982 I received information about a doctor in Athens, Greece that was treating cancer patients by helping their own immune systems fight the cancer cells. I became very interested and in May, 1982 traveled to Greece and took the series of treatments with the hope of curing my cancer.

In addition to my treatments, the Greek doctor also placed me on a very restrictive diet and rest program. The diet included drinking a minimum of eight glasses of distilled water every day for at least six months and recommended that I drink the distilled water the rest of my life. His theory is to eat and drink food and water without chemicals in order to give our immune system some relief. This will allow it to fight and destroy the cancer cell.

I have continued to drink the distilled water and get reports from my Oklahoma City doctor that I am completely clear of the cancer and my kidney function is excellent considering the damage caused by the radiation therapy.

I hope this will help you in making a decision about the use of distilled water in your diet.

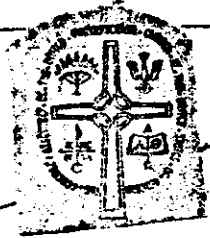

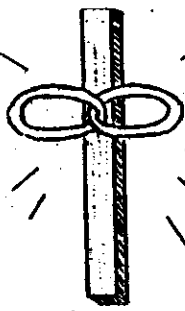

From January 1, 1975 through April 30, 1986, I averaged passing 10 kidney stones per year. In all probability, I passed more than this, but at least this many were large enough to cause me considerable pain and discomfort and forced me to enter the hospital twice for relief. I did not have surgery during that time span but the hours of pain and misery seemed to be unending. I can hardly remember a single day without pain during those eleven years.

During all that time, I have taken a diuretic tablet every day, salted nothing, and eaten virtually no dairy products.

Near the first of January, 1986, I began drinking pure, clear, distilled water processed by an Aqua Clean water distiller. By the end of April, I began to have several days in a row without kidney pain or any of the other problems associated with kidney stones.
